The highly competitive program provides singers with training, coaching, and myriad performance opportunities at the Ellie Caulkins Opera House and in schools, community centers, and other venues across the state. They take on select mainstage roles for Opera Colorado and are the featured performers in the annual student matinee.

Francesca Mehrotra | Soprano



Francesca Mehrotra is an Indian-American soprano originally from Ashburn, Virginia. In the 2022-23 Season, Francesca will perform in *Rigoletto* (Countess Ceprano, Gilda cover), the student matinee performance of *Rigoletto* (Gilda), and *Die tote Stadt* (Juliette). Also at Opera Colorado, she will sing in the touring productions of *The Pirates of Penzance* (Mabel) and *Romeo & Juliet* (Juliet). As an Apprentice Artist at Central City Opera, Francesca will appear in *The Light in the Piazza* (Clara cover) and *Die Fledermaus* (Ida). Previous performances include

Hansel and Gretel (Gretel) with Fort Worth Opera's Children's Opera Theatre; *Le nozze di Figaro* (Susanna) and *Giulio Cesare* (Cleopatra) at Seagle Festival; *The Ghosts of Gatsby* (Zelda '18) with Opera Birmingham at the Opera America New Works Fourm; *Don Pasquale* (Norina) and *Thumbprint* (Mukhtar Mai) at Boston Conservatory; *Serse* (Atalanta) at Opera NEO; and *Falstaff* (Nannetta), *A Midsummer Night's Dream* (Tytania), and *Dark Sisters* (Lucinda) at Texas Christian University. Francesca has a Master of Music in opera performance from the Boston Conservatory, and a Bachelor of Arts in music and a Bachelor of Science in strategic communication from Texas Christian University.

Joanne Evans | Mezzo-Soprano

More recently, Joanne made her role debut in *Eugene Onegin* (Olga) with Music Academy of the West. As an Artist in Residence with Opera Colorado, Joanne will perform in the mainstage production of *Rigoletto* (Giovanna, Maddalena cover) and *Die tote Stadt* (Lucienne). Through Opera Colorado's Opera on Tour program, Joanne will perform in *The Pirates of Penzance* (Ruth) and *Romeo & Juliet* (Stéphano/Gertrude). Joanne was recently named a

winner of the Met Opera Competition Boston District and was a finalist in the 2019 Harlem Opera Theatre competition.

David Soto Zambrana | Tenor



Tenor David Soto Zambrana is native to the sunny skies of San Juan, Puerto Rico. From the humble beginnings of a concert band, he eventually stepped onto the operatic stage, trained in the Bel Canto tradition by the legendary baritone Kim Josephson and certified Vocologist Dr. Leslie John Flanagan at the University of Oklahoma, where he was awarded a prestigious Weitzenhoffer Opera Fellowship and a master's degree. He worked closely with international opera star Marilyn Horne and sang multiple leading roles at the Reynolds Performing Arts Center. Recently,

David sang for the Oklahoma premiere of Lori Laitman's *The Scarlet Letter* (Arthur Dimmesdale). He was a Tomita Young Artist with Finger Lakes Opera, performed leading roles with Taconic Opera, and is an alumnus of Musiktheatre Bavaria in Oberaudorf, Germany. As an Artist in Residence, David will perform in the mainstage production of *Rigoletto* (Borsa) and will cover the role of the Duke of Mantua, which he will sing in the student matinee performance. He will also appear in *Die tote Stadt* and *Turandot*. He will perform in Opera Colorado's Opera on Tour productions of *The Pirates of Penzance* (Frederic) and *Romeo & Juliet* (Romeo). David was awarded a Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition Encouragement Award, Marilyn Horne Performance Award, and the Dame Eva Turner Award for Vocal Performance.

Oleg Bellini | Collaborative Pianist



Oleg Bellini was born and raised in Alessandria, Italy, the son of an opera singer. He holds a master's degree in piano performance from Conservatorio Statale di Musica A. Vivaldi in Italy. He also holds a master's degree in collaborative piano from the University of Georgia, where he studied with Dr. Liza Stepanova and Prof. Kathryn Wright. He completed graduate studies in harpsichord at the Royal College of Music in Stockholm, Sweden. While studying at UGA, Bellini served as assistant vocal coach and principal collaborative pianist to Prof. Frederick P. Burchinal and Prof. Kathryn Wright on Opera productions including *Don*

Giovanni, Le nozze di Figaro, Don Pasquale and many opera scenes productions. Oleg has performed as a solo pianist in cities across Europe and in the United States, including performances for the Stockholm Music Society in Sweden, Accademia R. Romanini of Brescia in

Italy, and Steinway Piano Galleries of Atlanta. He has participated in summer music festivals such as La Musica Lirica in Novafeltria, Italy, under the baton of Maestro Joseph Rescigno, and Stafford Opera troupe summer programs in Virginia. One of his most recent professional collaborations was with Mazowiecki Teatr Muzyczny's production of *The Merry Widow* in Warsaw, Poland, with Maestro Arif Dadashev. He joined Opera Colorado as the Collaborative Pianist for the Artist in Residence Program in 2021 and is excited to be returing for the second year with the Opera Colorado family. For the 40th Anniversary Season, he will act as répétiteur and pianist for the touring productions of *The Pirates of Penzance* and *Romeo & Juliet* as well as the student matinee production of *Rigoletto*.
